The Government proposes a final production deadline of January 20, 2017, stating it will be difficult to meet that date considering the potential national security implications, classification issues, and security restrictions. (ECF No. 87, p. 2). Defendants propose a deadline of November 18, 2016. Defendants argue the November deadline is nearly five months after service of the subpoena and they need the documents

are beginning to schedule depositions in November and they desire to have the documents prior to that date.

The court has considered the positions presented in both Statements. The Government argues Defendants will suffer no prejudice from the January deadline due to "the wide range of detailed information about the operation of the CIA program that the

Plaintiffs' position much information is already publicly available is supported by the extensive investigation conducted by the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence and the

report issued. However, the fact some information is publicly available does not foreclose Defendants from conducting additional discovery and the court granted in part

the Motion to Compel. However, with such information already available, the court finds

the identification of expert witnesses and further preparation of the case need not await

the CIA response to the subpoena. In addition, much of the information sought by the

Defendants relates to matters in which the Defendants were contractually involved in with the Government.

- 1. The Government shall complete its production of documents pursuant to the court's Order of October 4, 2016 (ECF No. 80) and the subpoena served on June 28, 2016, **no later than December 20, 2016**. The Government shall produce documents on a rolling basis, and shall file status reports as previously directed.
- 2. If Defendants determine some of the documents produced by the Government necessitate an amendment to their lay or expert witness lists, they may file a motion to

amend the witness list(s) if a demonstration of good cause for the amendment is shown.

3. Defendants have filed a Motion for Reconsideration/Clarification (ECF No. 32 in Case #16-36) of the court's October 4th Order. Defendants have also filed a Motion to Expedite (ECF No. 34). The Motion to Expedite is **GRANTED**. The Government has agreed to file a response in 5 business days and shall file such response no later than **October 26, 2016**. If Defendants determine a reply is necessary, it shall be filed no later than **October 31, 2016**, and the Motion for Reconsideration shall be deemed submitted on that date.

IT IS SO ORDERED. The Clerk is hereby directed to enter this Order and furnish copies to counsel.
