$\frac{\textbf{PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR PARTIAL SUMMARY JUDGMENT AND PERMANENT}}{\textbf{INJUNCTION}^2}$

Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 56, Plaintiffs hereby move for summary judgment on their first claim for relief on the ground that Plaintiffs are entitled to prevail on that claim as a matter of law. As further explained in the accompanying memorandum, Defendants' expansion of the Migrant Protection Protocols to Tamaulipas, Mexico, was arbitrary and capricious in violation of the Administrative Procedure Act. Plaintiffs' motion for the entry of a permanent injunction should be granted because they show that they will succeed on the merits of their first claim for relief, that they will be subject to irreparable harm if injunctive relief does not issue, and that the balance of equities and the public interest tip strongly in their favor.

Plaintiffs therefore request that the Court set aside this unlawful agency action and enter a permanent injunction against the Defendants. Specifically, Plaintiffs request that the Court order

Defendants to return Plaintiffs to the United States effective immediately, and allow them to continue to participate in their removal proceedings from within the United States.

Plaintiffs note that Defendants' motion to dismiss this case has been fully briefed for over five months. ECF 52, 54, 55. Given Plaintiffs' perilous situation in Tamaulipas, Plaintiffs urge the Court to consider this motion for partial summary judgment simultaneously with the pending motion to dismiss—or at least simultaneously with the motion to dismiss Claim One, the same claim at issue in this Motion.

This motion is based on the accompanying memorandum, declarations and exhibits filed in support; additional pleadings filed in this action; and such oral arguments and evidence as may be presented at a hearing on the motion. A proposed order and proposed injunction are attached for the Court's convenience.
