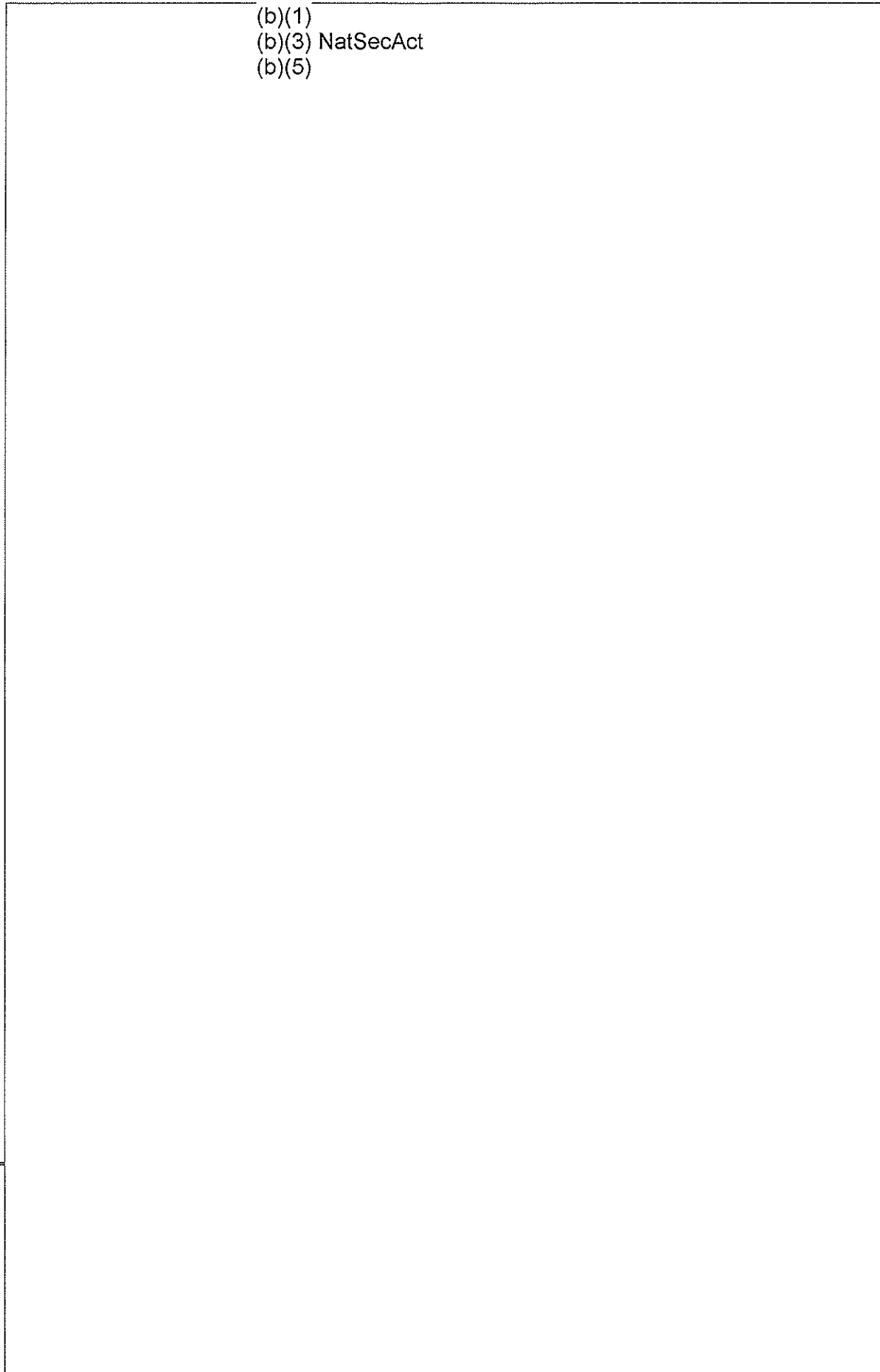

A. DECISION AUTHORITY: ORDINARILY, HQS WILL BE THE DECISION-MAKER WITH REGARD TO INTERRUPTING OR STOPPING THE ONGOING INTERROGATION OF ABU ZUBAYDA. IN SOME CASES, THERE MAY BE INSUFFICIENT TIME TO SOLICIT AND ACQUIRE A DECISION FROM HQS. IN THOSE CASES, ALL SIGNIFICANT MEMBERS OF THE INTERROGATION TEAM MUST BE ADEQUATELY CONSULTED AND SUCH A DECISION MUST BE CAREFULLY CONSIDERED. REQUESTS TO STOP OR INTERRUPT THE INTERROGATION PROCESS, INCLUDING THOSE BY MEDICAL AND SECURITY PERSONNEL, MUST BE HANDLED IN THE SAME MANNER. WE REALIZE THAT A SITUATION MAY ARISE WHERE SUCH CONSULTATION WITH HQS WILL NOT BE POSSIBLE, BUT WE ANTICIPATE THIS WILL BE IN ONLY THE MOST EXTREME CASES.

B. MEDICAL TREATMENT: THE INTERROGATION TEAM IS CORRECT IN ITS REF B UNDERSTANDING THAT THE INTERROGATION PROCESS TAKES PRECEDENCE OVER PREVENTATIVE MEDICAL PROCEDURES. ADDITIONALLY, OMS/ [] CONCUR WITH THE INTERROGATIONS BEING THE MOST IMPORTANT ASPECT OF THIS OPERATION. THE ONLY CONCERN REMAINS THE UNLIKELY POSSIBILITY THAT AZ DEVELOPS AN ACUTE MEDICAL PROBLEM RESULTING FROM A LACK OF PREVENTATIVE MEDICAL TREATMENT. WE RECOGNIZE THAT IF SUCH A PROBLEM WERE TO REQUIRE IMMEDIATE CARE, SUCH COULD INTERRUPT OR DERAIL THE PROGRESS OF THE INTERROGATIONS.

-- ALTHOUGH CONCERNED OVER THE DEVELOPMENT OF A CONDITION WHICH COULD NEGATIVELY AFFECT THE INTERROGATION PROCESS, OMS/ [] (b)(3) CIAAct WAS AMENABLE TO DEFERRING WOUND DRESSING FOR 72 HOURS AS THE NEXT PHASE OF THE INTERROGATIONS LAUNCHES.

-- OMS/ [] DID NOT AGREE WITH PROVIDING PROPHYLACTIC TREATMENT TO REDUCE THE POSSIBILITY OF AZ DEVELOPING AN INFECTION DURING THE 72 HOUR DELAY. THEY FELT THE PROPHYLACTIC WOULD HAVE A DETRIMENTAL AFFECT AND ACTUALLY INCREASE THE DIFFICULTY OF TREATING INFECTION SHOULD IT OCCUR.

-- PER DISCUSSIONS WITH THE SEVENTH FLOOR, THE DDO DOES NOT FEEL IT NECESSARY TO FURTHER RESTRICT CABLE TRAFFIC. HE INDICATED THAT SINCE FORMAL CHANNEL LEGAL APPROVALS WOULD EXIST, THERE IS NO NEED TO PLACE RESTRICTIONS ADDITIONAL TO "EYES ONLY." REQUEST
