Enclosed please find the Order Granting Plaintiffs Voes' and Roes' Applications for Temporary Injunction Against Jamie Masters, In Her Official Capacity as the Commissioner of The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, and The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services.

The Court continues to have under advisement PFLAG's and the Briggles' Applications for Temporary Injunction. Due to a previous commitment to attend and present at a CLE in Houston this week, the Court needs additional time to fully review the case law and factual record as to PFLAG and the Briggles Plaintiffs. The Court will rule expeditiously.

Meanwhile, Counsel will note that the Temporary Restraining Order entered in this case expires today on its face. DFPS's representative witness, Marta Talbert, testified that some cases were very close to reaching "ruled out" and "closed" case status, which the TRO prevented them from doing. Therefore, Defendant DFPS has the opportunity to move forward with their intended plan to close these cases with a "Ruled Out" finding.

In addition, the Court has a hearing on the Rule 76a motion set for August 3rd and will still plan on having a hearing on that date. The Court will rule on the pending temporary injunction no later than this date.

As a final matter, if the PFLAG or the Briggles Plaintiffs allege additional and separate immediate and irreparable harm while the application for temporary injunction is under advisement and choose to file for additional temporary relief in this case, they should alert the 201st District Court and reach out to my staff attorney and/or my judicial executive assistant for a setting, as well as notify the Office of the Attorney General. Additionally, if either side wishes to re-open the record to enter additional evidence on or before the August 3rd date, they should seek relief appropriately.
