**MODEL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
STATE/LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY**

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN THE

BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT
Montana State Office

AND THE

Prairie County Sheriff's Office

I. PURPOSE

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) provides for the increased protection of persons and property on the public lands and roads administered by the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management (BLM), through cooperation between the Prairie County Sheriff's Office and the BLM, by the granting and acceptance of authority for BLM law enforcement officers to enforce State and local laws and regulations pursuant to this MOU.

II. AUTHORITY

A. Bureau of Land Management

Section 303(d) of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (43 U.S.C. 1733(d)) provides that, in connection with the administration and regulation of the use and occupancy of the public lands, the Secretary is authorized to cooperate with the regulatory and law enforcement officials of any State or political subdivision thereof in the enforcement of the laws or ordinances of such State or subdivision.

B. Prairie County Sheriff

Montana Code Annotated 44-11-304 grants authority to the Sheriff to give written consent to Bureau of Land Management Law Enforcement Personnel to enforce the laws of the State of Montana and ordinances of the County of Prairie on property owned or possessed by the United States Government or any street, sidewalk, or property adjacent thereto.

III. DEFINITIONS

- A. Public Lands – Means any land and interest in land owned by the United States within the several States and administered by the Secretary of the Interior, through the BLM without regard to how the United States acquired ownership, except:
 - 1. Lands located on the outer Continental Shelf
 - 2. Lands held for the benefit of Indians, Aleuts, and Eskimos. 43 U.S.C, 1702 (e)
- B. Law Enforcement Officer (LEO) – Law Enforcement Rangers and Special Agents employed by the BLM who have been delegated law enforcement authority by the Director, BLM.
- C. State Director – The State Director, BLM, Montana State Office
- D. Special Agent-in-Charge (SAC) – BLM Special Agent-in-Charge for Region 4.
- E. Sheriff – Means the Sheriff of Prairie County.
- F. Sheriff’s Office – means the Prairie County Sheriff’s Office.
- G. Bureau – Means the Bureau of Land Management.
- H. Field Office Manager – means the Manager of the Bureau of Land Management, Miles City Field Office.

IV. PROCEDURES

- A. The Sheriff of Prairie County has the authority to enforce the laws of the state of Montana on such public lands administered by the BLM that lie within the confines of Prairie County; and is limited as to the amount of protection, patrol, and investigation that can be provided on those public lands, waters, roads, and trails administered by the BLM within Prairie County.
- B. The State Director, SAC, and the Prairie Sheriff’s Office hereby mutually agree that it is desirable to cooperate and collaborate in better utilizing the resources of both agencies while providing for more adequate protection of persons and property on the public lands as follows:
 - 1. The Prairie County Sheriff’s Office agrees to continue to enforce the civil and criminal laws of the State of Montana on the public lands, waters, roads, and trails administered by the BLM within the normal scope of duty to the extent of current financial and manpower resources without reimbursement by the BLM.

2. The BLM agrees, within the availability of funds and established Federal regulations and policies, to enforce the authorized Federal laws and regulations pertaining to the public lands administered by the BLM, and State and local laws in connection with their duties in the administration and regulation of the use and occupancy of the public lands as defined herein.
3. The Prairie County Sheriff's Office and the BLM mutually agree to provide the maximum cooperation, assistance, and coordination possible, within the availability of funds and established laws, regulations, and policies governing the respective agencies that will assure the protection of persons and property on the public lands, waters, roads, and trails administered by the BLM within the confines of Prairie County, Montana.
4. The Prairie County Sheriff's Office further agrees that pursuant to Montana Code Annotated 44-11-304 will designate certain identified BLM LEOs as peace officers of the Prairie County Sheriff's Office for enforcement of state laws in the County of Prairie, Montana. The Prairie County Sheriff's Office further understands and agrees that the BLM LEOs so designated are limited by the BLM to exercise said enforcement authority only in connection with their duties in the administration and regulation of the use and occupancy of the public lands as defined herein. All LEOs will be further instructed that the BLM may discipline any of its LEOs who exercise State and/or local law enforcement authority in violation of the restrictions imposed upon them by the BLM. Prior to any such designation, the BLM agrees to provide any training required by State or local law, or by the Sheriff of Prairie County to such specified BLM LEOs.

It is understood and agreed that the authority granted by the Prairie County Sheriff's Office includes authority to execute any valid State or local warrant that the Prairie County Sheriff's Office has the authority to execute and for which the Prairie County Sheriff's Office has the authority to grant. However, it is understood that BLM limits its LEOs to exercise such authority only in connection with their duties in the administration and regulation of the use and occupancy of the public lands as defined herein, and, when feasible, upon the request of the Prairie County Sheriff's Office.

5. The BLM further agrees to take the following mutually agreed upon actions related to violations of the State of Montana.
 - a. To respond to requests for back-up services to each other in emergency "officer needs assistance" situations, as may be reasonable, prudent, and necessary under the circumstances. It is further understood and agreed that all officers will be instructed that BLM LEOs are limited to responding to those situations not on public lands where they are the closest available officer and are within reasonable proximity, considering all factors, to the situation requiring assistance.

- b. To issue citations, arrest, and/or release persons suspected of violations of Montana State laws, regulations, or ordinances related to the administration and regulation of the use, occupancy, and development of Public Lands.
- c. To detain persons suspected of violating Montana laws, regulations, or ordinances, any witnesses to those violations, and to protect any related crime scene, pending arrival of the State or local agency having primary jurisdiction.
- d. To arrest, transport, and release to an available State or Local law enforcement officer any person having a valid State or local warrant for his/her arrest when requested by the Prairie County Sheriff's Office.
- e. To take other mutually agreed upon actions related to violations of laws, regulations and ordinances of the State of Montana.

V. SCOPE AND CONDITIONS

- A. Neither party shall be liable to the other or to its agents or employees for any loss, damage, personal injury, or death occurring in consequence of the performance of this MOU, except as provided herein.
- B. No member of, or delegate to Congress, or State Official, shall be admitted to any share or part of this MOU, or any benefit that may arise there from.
- C. The BLM LEOs will remain under the supervision and responsibility of the BLM. The BLM LEOs shall not be considered as coming within the scope of the Prairie County Sheriff's Office employment and none of the benefits of Prairie County Sheriff's Office will be conferred under this MOU.
- D. During the performance of this MOU, the participants agree to abide by the terms of Executive Order 11246 on nondiscrimination and will not discriminate against any person because of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, or national origin. The participants will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, or national origin.
- E. Each party will furnish written information necessary for mutual enforcement operations.
- F. Any issues which cannot be reconciled between the Prairie County Sheriff's Office and individual BLM LEOs or any issue that affects either party's performance under this MOU shall be referred to the SAC. The SAC will be responsible for coordinating with the appropriate officials to mutually resolve any issue.

- G. Nothing in this MOU will be construed as affecting the authorities of either party or as binding beyond their respective authorities.
- H. Nothing in this MOU shall obligate the BLM to expend appropriation or to enter into any contract or other obligation. Specific work projects or activities that involve the transfer of funds, service, or property between the parties to this MOU will require the execution of separate agreements or contracts, contingent upon the availability of funds as appropriated by Congress. Each subsequent agreement or arrangement involving the transfer of funds, service, or property shall be made in writing and shall be independently authorized by appropriate statutory authority and regulations, including those applicable to procurement activities.
- I. Subject to availability of funds, each party agrees to fund their own expenses associated with the implementation of this MOU. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as obligating the BLM to any expenditure or obligation of funds in excess or in advance of appropriations, in accordance with the Anti-Deficiency Act, 31 U.S.C. § 1341.
- J. Any records or documents generated as a result of this MOU shall be part of the official BLM record maintained in accordance with applicable BLM Records Management policies. Any request for release of records associated with the implementation of this MOU to anyone outside the parties must be determined based on applicable laws, including the Freedom of Information Act and the Privacy Act.
- K. This MOU shall be effective from the date of execution and shall remain in effect for five years, unless terminated with a 60-day written notice from either party to the other party. This MOU may be modified or amended upon written request of either party and written concurrence of the other party.

BRIEFING PAPER

KXL Pipeline Project Law Enforcement planning

SUBJECT:

The Keystone XL (KXL) Project is a federally permitted crude oil pipeline, beginning in Hardisty, Alberta, and extending south to Steele City, Nebraska.

Law enforcement is currently conducting planning meetings in anticipation of a similar response during the KXL construction that occurred in North Dakota related to the Dakota Access Pipeline (DAPL) construction.

BACKGROUND:

In Montana there will be 285 miles of pipeline constructed. Approximately 44 miles of pipeline will go through BLM administered public lands. (ATTACHMENT 1; maps 1-3) There will be three sections under construction at the same time. Three “man camps” will be established to house construction personnel. Each man camp will have a security adviser and security personnel hired by TransCanada. Construction will begin in 2018 and is planned to conclude in 2020. The work window each year will be from June to December. No night work is anticipated. Work week will be 5-6 days depending on the progress and schedule.

Below is a table showing the Montana counties impacted, miles of pipeline through each county, and local law enforcement resources per county.

BLM PLANNING AND ROLE:

BLM OLE's has actively participated in all law enforcement planning meetings and will continue to do so. OLE met with the Acting United States Attorney in Montana to brief his office on potential impacts to federal lands and responses. The US Attorney's office indicated they will begin participation in LE planning meetings.

4. Firefighting – anticipation of wildland fires/safety for firefighters.
5. Aviation Planning – air support for LE operations as needed. (Note: during the DAPL incident there were two incidents of lasers were used against law enforcement support aircraft)
 - a. Drones
 - b. Surveillance (officer safety)
 - c. Medical/first aid

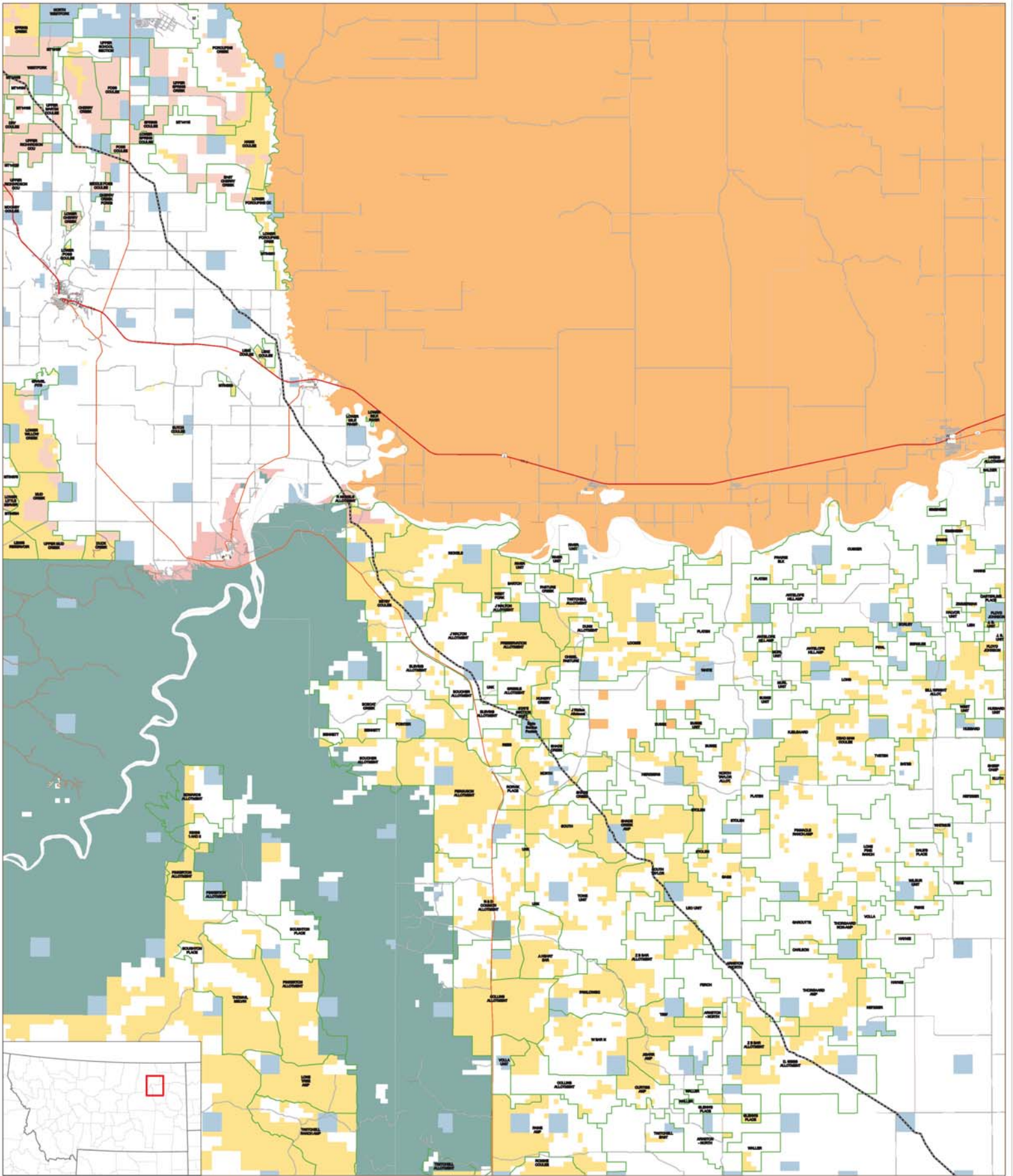

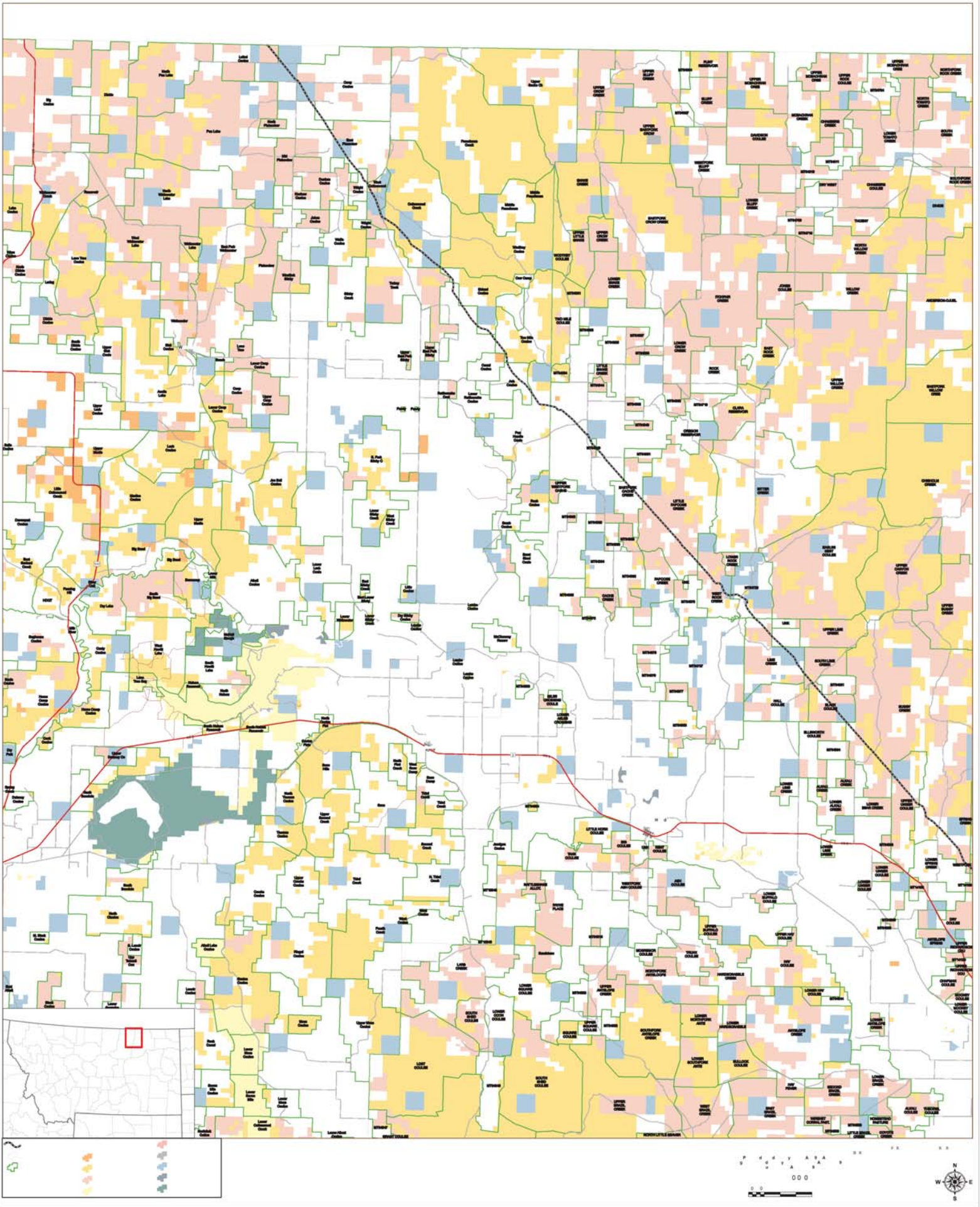


Keystone XL Pipeline



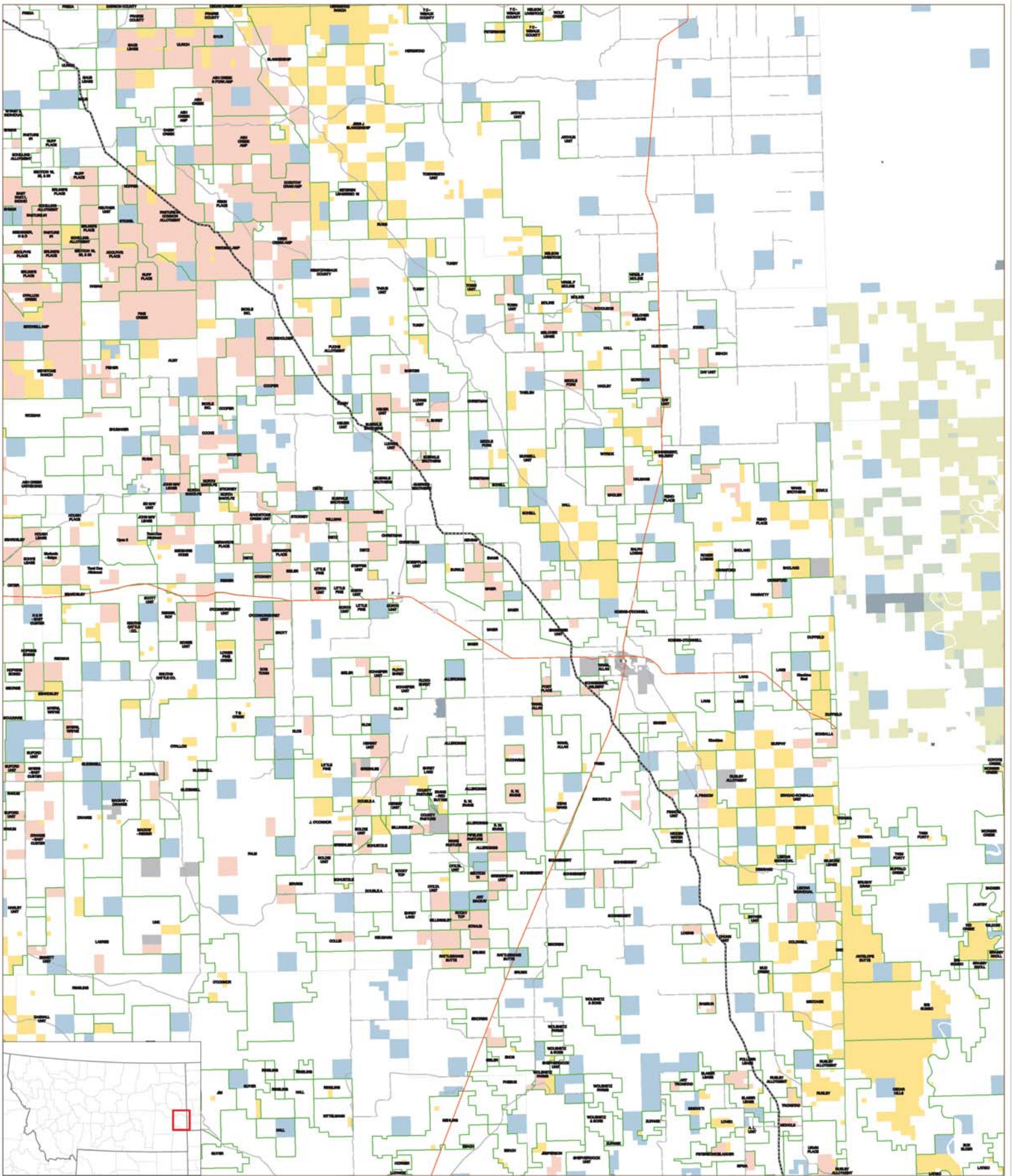

Slaughtered, mutilated or missing livestock; cattle and calves moved closer to home earlier than usual, costing more in feed and management. Vandalized equipment and farmsteads; repairs and losses associated with cut and damaged fences. Hay unable to be moved for sale or consumption; farm equipment unable to be moved to harvest or hay; fuel to move heavy equipment, such as combines, home to the yard every night due to fear of vandalism if left in the field.

² Firewood was brought to the protest camps from states under a quarantine and possibly infested with the pests emerald ash borer and gypsy moth. If the firewood contains those destructive pests, North Dakota forests could be decimated. The Department has spent at least 200 hours on this issue alone and anticipates an additional 6-10 day cleanup effort once grounds are accessible to try to prevent the spread of these pests into North Dakota come spring thaw.

³ Calls from concerned farmers/ranchers; time spent on various protest-related issues affecting agriculture, including: firewood, animal health, pesticides, emergency management, and consumer hotlines/public information. Disruption from protest activities inside and around the State Capitol building, which resulted in early dismissal, building lockdowns and overall distractions from regular responsibilities.

4 Families reported fear of leaving their homes and farmsteads; strangers taking photos or videotaping rural residents; vehicles and masked protestors playing chicken with local residents on county roads or shaking fists at them as they drive by; farmers and ranchers feeling they are in harm's way and arming themselves; extra expenses incurred for security systems, gas money to go around roadblocks, families staying in Bismarck-Mandan hotels out of fear for their own personal safety; rural route buses escorted to schools by law enforcement.

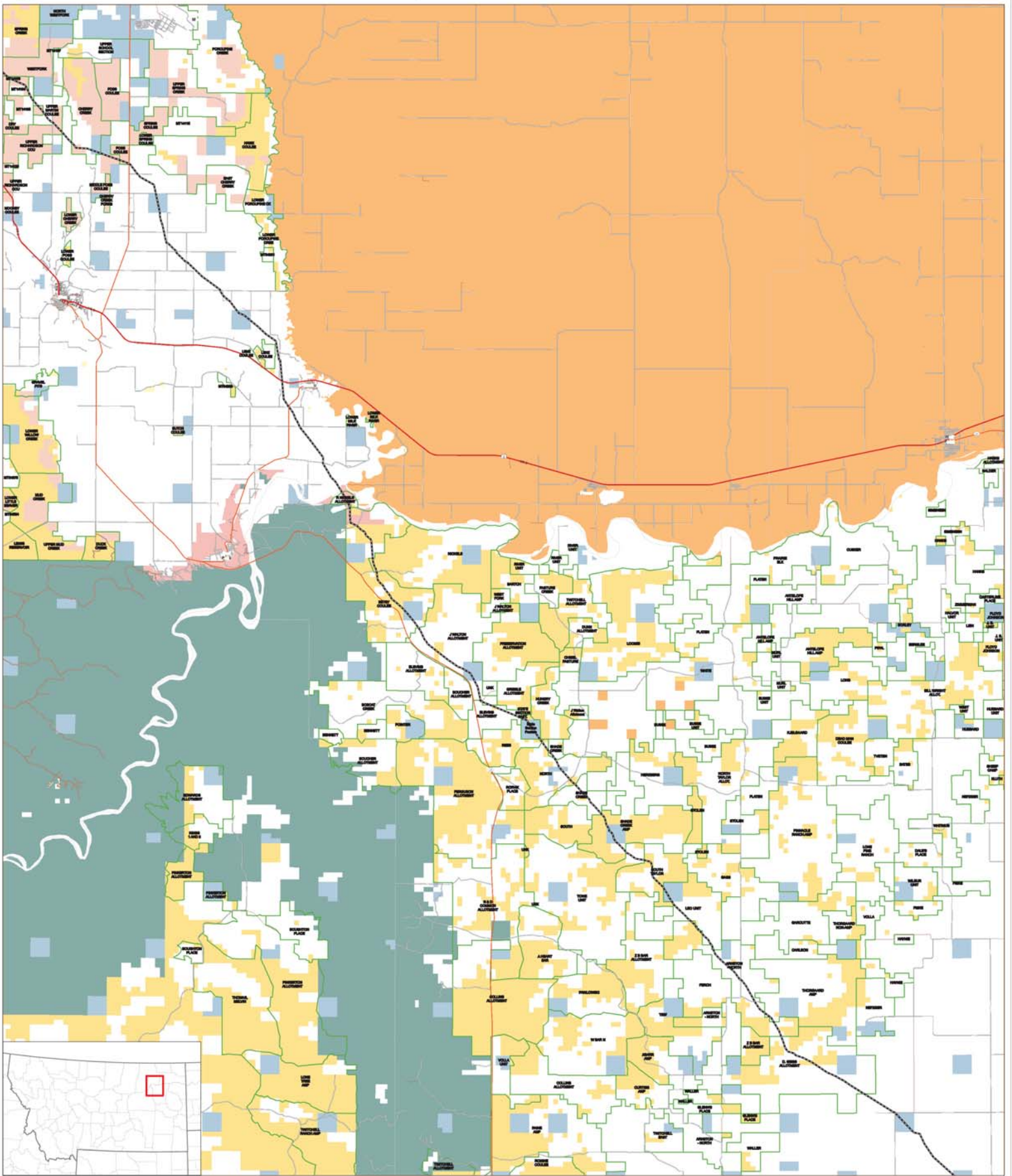

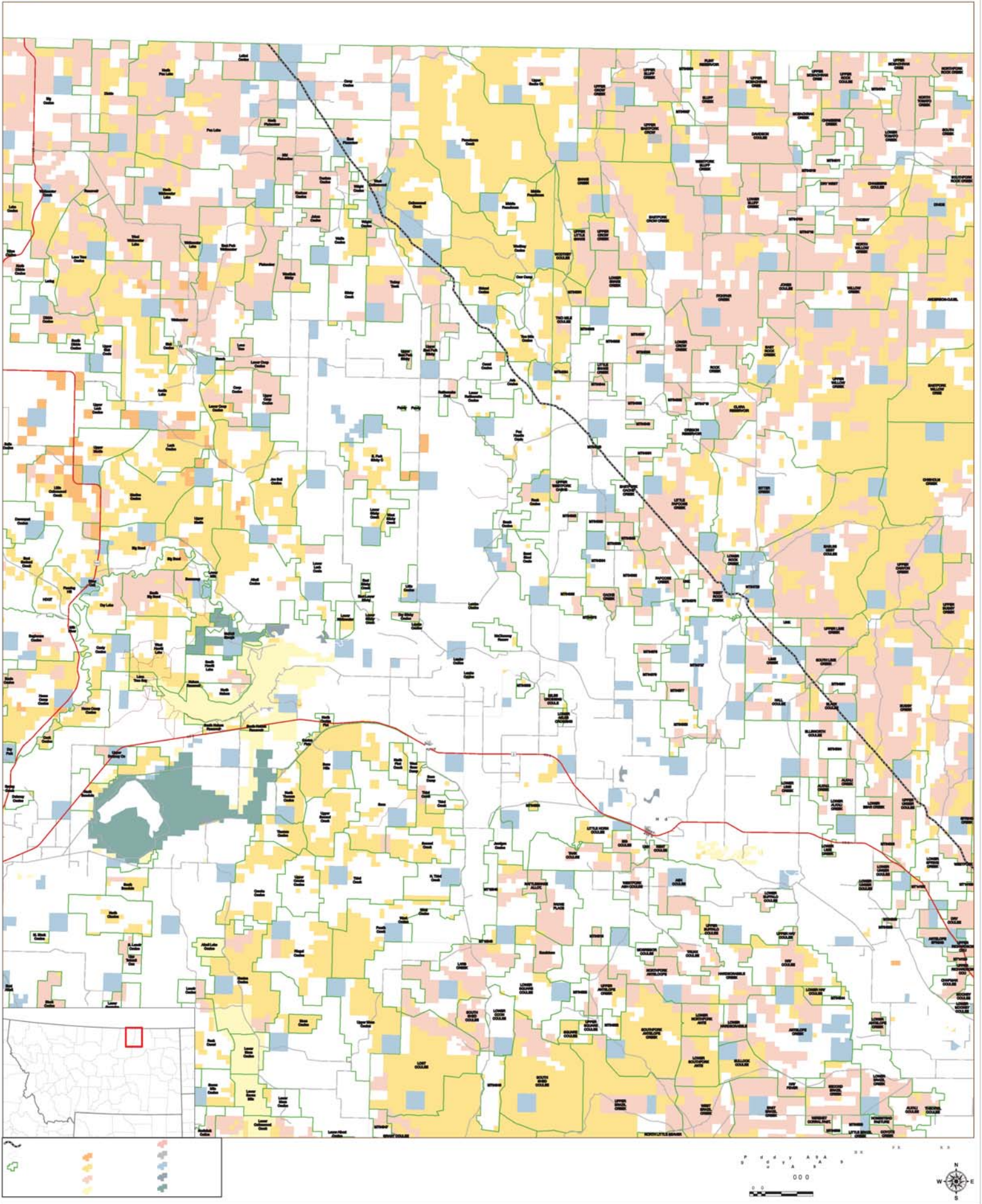


Keystone XL Pipeline



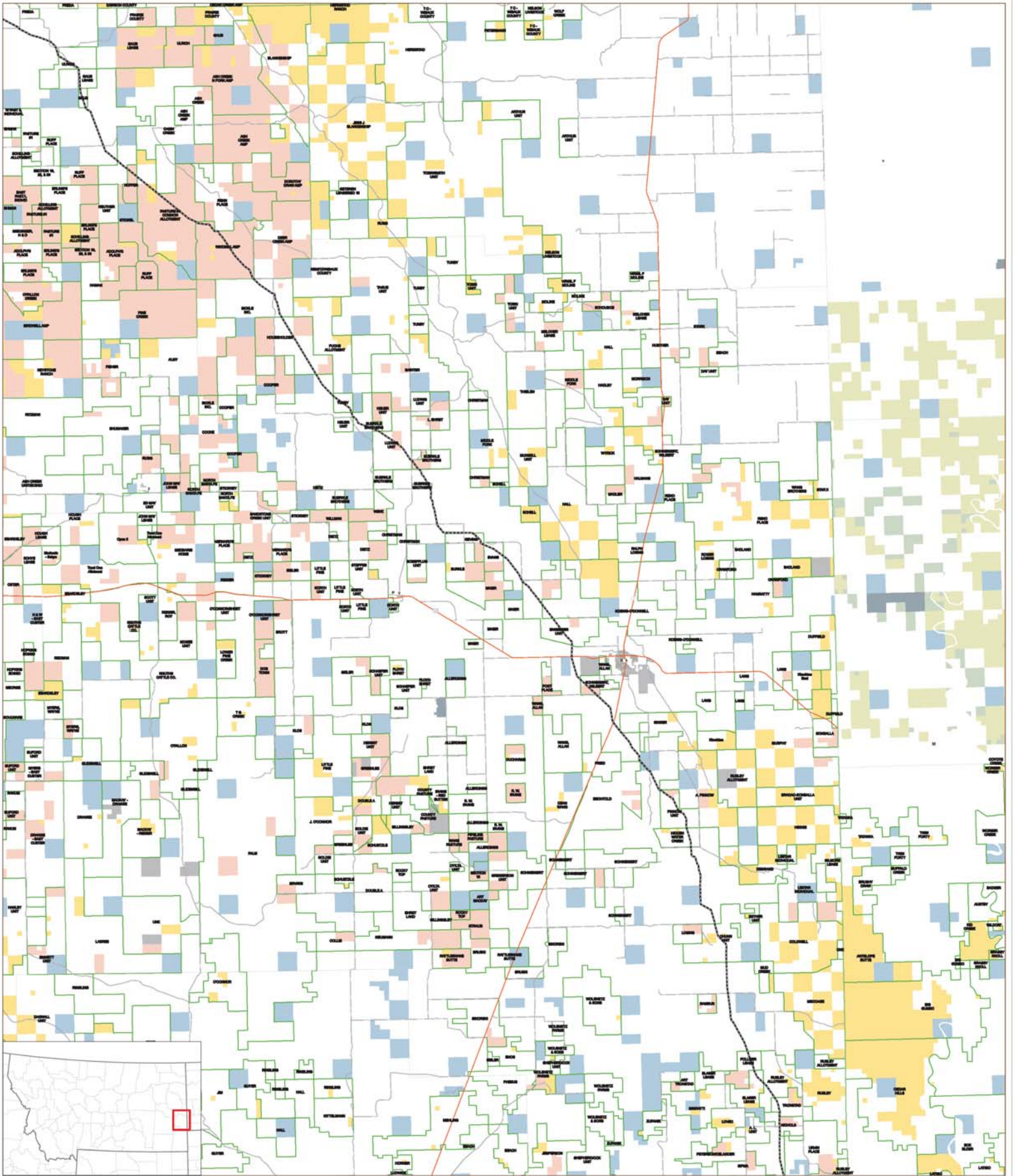

BISMARCK, ND – The North Dakota Highway Patrol logged more hours in flight during the six months of the Dakota Access Pipeline protest than they would typically fly over the course of four years. KXL Pipeline Project Law Enforcement planning

SUBJECT:

The Keystone XL (KXL) Project is a federally permitted crude oil pipeline, beginning in Hardisty, Alberta, and extending south to Steele City, Nebraska.

Law enforcement is currently conducting planning meetings in anticipation of a similar response during the KXL construction that occurred in North Dakota related to the Dakota Access Pipeline (DAPL) construction.

BACKGROUND:

In Montana there will be 285 miles of pipeline constructed. Approximately 44 miles of pipeline will go through BLM administered public lands. (ATTACHMENT 1; maps 1-3) There will be three sections under construction at the same time. Three “man camps” will be established to house construction personnel. Each man camp will have a security adviser and security personnel hired by TransCanada. Construction will begin in 2018 and is planned to conclude in 2020. The work window each year will be from June to December. No night work is anticipated. Work week will be 5-6 days depending on the progress and schedule.

Below is a table showing the Montana counties impacted, miles of pipeline through each county, and local law enforcement resources per county.

The cost of policing and cleanup for the incident in ND pertaining to the DAPL was \$38 million. (ATTACHMENT 2) According to ND Morton County Sheriff _____, he had over 1500 law enforcement personnel from 150 law enforcement agencies from various state, county, and city agencies from within ND and throughout the country respond to the mutual aid request during this incident.

said that during the high point of the incident there were over 10,000 protestors involved. There were as many as 127 arrest in one day during this event. The cost to clean up the abandoned protest camp was over \$3 million. There were 709 arrests made during the incident of which 94% were from out of state.
